architects and designers who were tired of the "Death by PowerPoint" presentations prevailing at many events. Pecha Kucha means "chit-chat" in Japanese and has come to represent a form of
presenting in which 20 slides appear for 20 seconds each (hence the time limit of six minutes and 40
seconds) while the presenter talks. To see such presentations in practice, watch some examples on the Pecha Kucha website. Pecha Kucha evenings have now become common events at international
conferences, but can you incorporate this style of presentation into your business English training? I'm keen to try it, as I believe it has the following benefits for students:
