




Fig. 12 – Rome, La Magliana : plan restitué du sanctuaire à l'époque sévérienne (éch : 1 : 2000).

## The steps of a vow

1. *votum concipere*  
define the wording of a vow
2. *votum nuncupare*  
pronounce the vow
3. *votum suscipere*  
assume the obligation to the God
4. *voti damnatus* ou *voti reus*  
obligation to the God
5. *votum solvere* ou *votum reddere*  
fulfillment of the vow

## 1. *votum concipere*



Valerius Venustus, vir perfectissimus, governor of Rhetia, renovated a temple for the undefeated god Sol from top to bottom. As he had defined the wording of his vow, he fulfilled it, willingly and deservedly, after his healing from an illness.

## What happens when the God does not fulfill his part of the vow?

Donec, en Grèce et à Rome, le vœu était un contrat entre l'homme et la divinité, contrat proposé par l'homme, qui en fixait lui-même les deux termes, c'est-à-dire ce qu'il demandait et ce qu'en échange il offrait à la divinité. La divinité pouvait ne pas l'accepter ; si elle refusait sa faveur ou sa protection, le contrat tombait de lui-même ; mais, si elle acceptait le contrat, si elle accordait à l'homme ce qu'il demandait, celui-ci ne pouvait plus se soustraire à l'obligation qu'il avait contractée ; il était, suivant la forte expression des Romains, condamné à s'acquitter de son vœu. A quelle sanction s'exposait-il, s'il manquait à sa parole ? Sans aucun doute, il encourait la colère divine ; c'est pour ne pas attirer sur eux cette colère que les Ornéates cherchèrent et trouvèrent le moyen de s'acquitter, sans sacrifices trop lourds pour eux, de leur vœu imprudent<sup>9</sup> ;



Innox lenuarianus, who lived 6 years, 2 months, 15 days. His parents have made the grave, despite a vow.



## **At the moment of the death of Germanicus: Suet., Caligula 5**

(2) Quo defunctus est die, lapidata sunt templa, subversae deum aerae, Lares a quibusdam familiares in publicum abiecti, partus coniugum expositi.

(2) On the day when he died, stones were thrown against the temples, and the altars of the gods were overthrown; some people threw their Lares familiares into the streets; others exposed their newborn children.


### Martial, epigram 40
