RELIGION AND LAWS

- Numa Pompilius and Egeria
- Grave of Numa Pompilius
- Ius divinum – came directly from the will of Gods
- Ius publicum – regulated the relationships between the Roman government and citizens of Rome
- Ius privatum - regulated the relationships between individuals



FAS AND NEFAS

- Fas – what can be acceptable
- Nefas – what cannot be acceptable

- Dies fas et nefas – days when decisions of the senat or people assambles, state actions, war decisions can be done



IUS AND LEX

- Ius – Right; permit or authorization to act
- Lex – Law; a rule of conduct

- Punishment with death
