



Vowels

Monophthongs



[Monophthongs](#) of Urban East Norwegian on an auditory vowel chart, from [Vanvik \(1979:13\)](#). Note that modern sources tend to describe /ɑ, a:/ as back [ɑ, a:], rather than central [ɒɒ, ɒɒ].

- Unless preceding another vowel within the same word, all unstressed vowels are short. [18]
- /e:/ , ø:/ are frequently realized as centering diphthongs [eə, øə]. /i:/ , y:/ , u:/ , ɔ:/ / can also be realized as [ie, ye, ue, œ], yet /ʉ:/ , æ:/ , a:/ / are always monophthongal. [19][20] However, according to [Kvitte & Gude-Husken \(2005\)](#), the diphthongal variants of /e[], ø[], []/ are opening [e[][], ø[][], [][]], not centering. [21]
