

②存 means to leave something somewhere for safe keeping, e.g., 在銀行存錢/在银行存钱 (to deposit money at a bank), 在機場存車/在机场存车 (to park one's car at an airport), 在超市 (chāoshì) 存包 (to check one's bag in a supermarket), 把東西存在朋友家/把东西存在朋友家 (to leave things at a friend's place).

Culture Highlights

- 1 Higher education in China used to be free. Beginning in the late 1980s, the state started to charge tuition. Surveys in recent years have repeatedly shown that educational expenses are the largest expense in the average household's annual budget, more than savings for retirement or housing expenditures. Both need- and merit-based scholarships are available. Parents, however, remain the main source of financial support for Chinese college students.
- Increasingly, Chinese college students work on or off campus to offset living expenses. The most popular form of part-time employment is tutoring elementary and middle school students. Depending on the subject, the work can be quite lucrative, especially musical instrument instruction. Some college students work in sales, do creative work such as graphic design, or engage in translation services.

1. Directional Complements Suggesting Result

By definition, directional complements have to do with direction. For instance, 來/来 signifies movement toward the speaker; 上 indicates upward movement, and so on. However, many directional complements do not actually deal with direction in a literal sense, but rather suggest a result or state of being. In this lesson, we have directional complements that express result.

① 他們希望兩個孩子能受到良好的教育,所以孩子一生下來就開始給他們存教育費。 他们希望两个孩子能受到良好的教育,所以孩子一生下来就开始给他们存教育费。

(They hoped that their two children would get a good education. Therefore, they started to save for their educational expenses as soon as the children were born.)

Here, 下來/下来 implies detachment or separation of one thing from another. Similarly, we say 從本子上撕 (sī) 下一張紙來/从本子上撕 (sī) 下一张纸来 (tear a piece of paper from a notebook), 把西瓜切 (qiē) 下來一塊/把西瓜切 (qiē) 下来一块 (cut a slice off a watermelon), etc.

每年開學的時候,家裏還是得拿出很多錢來。 每年开学的时候,家里还是得拿出很多钱来。 (Every year at the beginning of the school year, [my] family still has to come up with a lot of money.)

出來/出来 signifies the emergence of something from a hidden place into the open or a change from having nothing to having something:

- 图 把你的問題說出來,我們大家幫你解決。 把你的问题说出来,我们大家帮你解决。 (Tell us your problem; get it out in the open. We will help you solve it.)
- 我看出來他生氣了。我看出来他生气了。(I could tell that he got angry.)

6 給孩子想出來一個好名字。 给孩子想出来一个好名字。 (Come up with a good name for the child.)

上,上來/上来,上去,下,下來/下来,下去,出,出來/出来,過/过, 過來/过来,過去/过去,起,起來/起来,開/开, etc., all can convey result. It is important to understand the meaning of these directional complements when they are used in this sense. Try to memorize them together with their preceding verbs.

2. 來/来 Connecting Two Verb Phrases

When來/来 connects two verb phrases with the second phrase indicating a purpose, it is similar to "to," or "in order to" in English.

- → 大家決定開一個舞會來給他過生日。
 大家決定开一个舞会来给他过生日。
 (Everybody decided to throw a dance party to celebrate his birthday.)
- 2 我覺得自己已經長大了,應該做一些工作來減輕父母的 負擔。 我觉得自己已经长大了,应该做一些工作来减轻父母的 负担。 (I feel I'm all grown up already. I should get a job to ease my parents' burden.)
- 3 我妹妹告訴我應該用聽錄音的辦法來提高漢語水平。 我妹妹告诉我应该用听录音的办法来提高汉语水平。 (My younger sister tells me I should listen to recordings to improve my Chinese.)

3.The Dynamic Particle 了 (II)

We have already learned that \mathcal{T} can indicate the realization of an action or the emergence of a state. However, that does not mean that \mathcal{T} is always required with completed actions, as in this lesson:

In the above passage,

is a completed event. However, it is presented as part of the background information to the main narrative, 這時候麗莎和雪梅走了進來/这时候丽莎和雪梅走了 进来. That is why the verb 存 does not take 了.

4. Rhetorical Questions

Rhetorical questions are interrogative in form, but the speaker is really emphasizing a point rather than asking a real question for which an answer is expected, for example,

他昨天根本没復習,怎麽能考100分呢?
 他昨天根本没复习,怎么能考100分呢?
 (He didn't review at all yesterday. How could he get a hundred on the test?)

The speaker is saying of course there's no way he could get a full score. The sentence is affirmative in form but negative in meaning.

他已經學了三年化學了,這麼簡單的問題難道他不會嗎? 他已经学了三年化学了,这么简单的问题难道他不会吗?

(He's been studying chemistry for three years. Are you telling me he can't solve such a simple problem?)

The sentence is negative in form, but emphatically positive in meaning: "Surely, he should know how to solve the problem!"

Generally speaking, rhetorical questions that are affirmative in form carry an emphatically negative meaning; rhetorical questions that are negative in form carry an emphatically positive meaning. For more examples, see the following two sentences from this lesson:

動態原不想想,父母挣錢多不容易啊? 她怎么不想想,父母挣钱多不容易啊? (How come she doesn't give any thought to how hard it is for her parents to earn money?)

The speaker means that she should think about this issue.

維不知道你是父母的乖孩子!
 谁不知道你是父母的乖孩子!
 (Who doesn't know you are an exemplary child?)
 [Everyone knows that you're an exemplary child.]

5. Adverb 可

I is employed in colloquial speech to lend force to a statement. You can leave out I without changing the meaning, but the tone of voice will be weakened:

① 我可做不出這樣的事情。 我可做不出这样的事情。 (I would never be able to do a thing like that, not me.)

- ② A: 下個月有一個說中文的比賽,老師讓你去。 下个月有一个说中文的比赛,老师让你去。 (Next month there will be a Chinese speech contest. The teacher is asking you to go.)
 - B: 我可不行,一看見人多就緊張得說不出話來。 我可不行,一看见人多就紧张得说不出话来。 (Not me! I get tongue-tied as soon as I get in front of a crowd.)
- (Didn't you say that you would be able to ace this class without any preparation?)
 - B: 你别亂說。我可没說過。 你别乱说。我可没说过。 (Nonsense. Not me, I never said that.)



Words & Phrases

A.壓力/压力 (pressure)

壓力/压力 is a noun, often appearing in patterns such as 有壓力/有压力,給…壓力/给…压力, or 對…的壓力/对…的压力.

- 1 考試考得不好, 怕媽媽生氣, 我覺得有壓力。 考试考得不好, 怕妈妈生气, 我觉得有压力。 (I didn't do well on the exam and I'm worried that my mom will be mad. I feel a lot of pressure.)
- ② 這次考研究生,我的指導教授給我很大的壓力。 这次考研究生,我的指导教授给我很大的压力。 (This time I'm taking the entrance exam for graduate school and my advisor has given me a lot of pressure.)
- ③ 今年經濟很糟糕,我一直找不到工作,這對我的壓力很大。 很大。 今年经济很糟糕,我一直找不到工作,这对我的压力 很大。 (The economy is doing really badly this year. I can't find a job and this puts a lot of

B. 受到 (to receive)

pressure on me.)

受到 is often followed by the below abstract nouns, which are usually qualified as indicated by brackets below, e.g., 受到(大家的)歡迎/欢迎 (receive [everyone's] welcome); 受到(良好的)教育 (receive [a very good] education); 受到(老師的)影響/(老师的)影响 (receive [the teacher's] influence).

C. 減輕/减轻 (to lessen)

減輕/减轻 is generally followed by an abstract noun, e.g., 減輕負擔/减轻负担 (to lessen the burden), 減輕壓力/减轻压力 (to alleviate the pressure), 減輕痛苦/减轻痛苦 (to lessen the pain).

- ① 學生希望老師少給一些功課,減輕他們的負擔。 学生希望老师少给一些功课,減轻他们的负担。 (The students wish that the teacher would assign them less homework so as to lighten their burden.)
- 2 找到工作了,他的壓力減輕了不少。 找到工作了,他的压力减轻了不少。 (Now that he's found a job, he feels a load has been taken off his shoulders.)
- 图 生想了很多辦法來減輕他的痛苦 (tòngkǔ) ° 医生想了很多办法来减轻他的痛苦 (tòngkǔ) ° (The doctor tried many different ways to ease his pain.)

D. 適合/适合 (to suit) and 合適/合适 (suitable)

In Level 1 we learned 合適/合适 as an adjective meaning "suitable." In this lesson we have 適合/适合, meaning "to suit." 適合/适合 is a transitive verb; in other words, it must be followed by a noun or occur in a "pivotal sentence" in which the object also serves as the subject of the following clause.

Note the contrasting functions of these two words in the following sentences:

- ① 這條牛仔褲不適合你穿,你媽媽穿可能合適。 这条牛仔裤不适合你穿,你妈妈穿可能合适。 (These jeans don't suit you. They might be suitable for your mom.)
- ② 這種傢具適合家裏用,放在辦公室不合適。 这种家具适合家里用,放在办公室不合适。 (This kind of furniture suits home use [more]. It's not suitable to be put in an office.)

③ 這個專業不適合你,你還是選別的專業吧。 这个专业不适合你,你还是选別的专业吧。 (This major doesn't suit you. You'd better pick another major.)

E. 影響/影响 (to influence or affect; influence)

影響/影响 can be a verb:

- ●覺的時間不夠會影響健康。 [verb] 睡觉的时间不够会影响健康。 (Not having enough time to sleep will affect one's health.)
- ② 你看書吧,我坐在這兒不説話,不會影響你。[verb] 你看书吧,我坐在这儿不说话,不会影响你。 (Why don't you study? I'll sit here quietly and won't distract you.)

影響/影响 can also be a noun and often appears in the pattern of A 對/对 B 有影響/影响 (A has an influence on B) as seen in ③:

⑥ 你不去開這個會,對你找工作會有影響。[noun]你不去开这个会,对你找工作会有影响。 (If you don't go to the meeting, it'll affect your chances of getting a job.)

F. 取得 (to obtain)

取得 is also followed by abstract nouns such as 經驗/经验, 同意, 好成績/好成绩 (hǎo chéngjì, success; a good grade), 進步/进步 (jìnbù, progress).

G. 説到/说到 (speaking of)

To expand on a topic already mentioned, we can say 説到/说到···

説到錢,我的同屋今天跟我說,她媽媽生氣了,不給她錢了。说到钱,我的同屋今天跟我说,她妈妈生气了,不给她钱了。

(Speaking of money, my roommate told me that her mom got angry and wouldn't give her any more money.)

- ② A: 你想什麼呢? 你想什么呢? (What are you thinking?)
 - B: 我在想下個學期選什麽課呢。 我在想下个学期选什么课呢。 (I'm thinking about what classes I should take next semester.)
 - A: 説到下個學期的課, 我們可以不選我們學校的課嗎? 说到下个学期的课, 我们可以不选我们学校的课吗? (Speaking of next semester's classes, can we choose not to take our school's classes?)
 - B: 那你選哪兒的課? 那你选哪儿的课? (Then where will you take classes?)
 - A: 我想去中國留學。 我想去中国留学。 (I want to go to China to study abroad.)

- B: 我不知道行不行,可能得取得指導教授的同意,你去問問吧。 我不知道行不行,可能得取得指导教授的同意,你去问问吧。 (I don't know if you can or not. You probably have to get permission from your advisor. You should go ask.)
- (3) A: 聽說張天明的表哥打球打得很棒。 听说张天明的表哥打球打得很棒。 (I hear Zhang Tianming's cousin is a great ballplayer.)
 - B: 説到打球, 我們這個週末去打籃球好嗎? 说到打球, 我们这个周末去打篮球好吗? (Speaking of playing ball, should we go play basketball this weekend?)

H. 嫌 (to dislike)

嫌 is a verb meaning "to dislike, to detest." It is usually followed by a clause.

- ① 我妹妹嫌這個餐館兒的菜太油太鹹。 我妹妹嫌这个餐馆儿的菜太油太咸。 (My little sister dislikes the fact that the food at this restaurant is so greasy and salty.)
- ② 小林嫌她男朋友做事太馬虎,所以跟他分手了。 小林嫌她男朋友做事太马虎,所以跟他分手了。 (Xiao Lin didn't like the fact that her boyfriend was so careless. That was why she broke up with him.)
- 我同屋嫌在餐館兒打工太累,挣錢太少,決定另外找工作。 工作。 我同屋嫌在餐馆儿打工太累,挣钱太少,决定另外找工作。

(My roommate thought that working at the restaurant was too exhausting and the pay was too little, so he decided to look for a job elsewhere.)

I. 不是 A, 就是 B (if it's not A, it's B; either A or B)

This pattern is often used to enumerate two predictable scenarios:

- 她嫌學校餐廳的菜不好吃,不是叫外賣,就是跟同學去 飯館。 她嫌学校餐厅的菜不好吃,不是叫外卖,就是跟同学去 饭馆。
 - (She finds the food at the school cafeteria unappetizing, so she either orders takeout or goes out to restaurants with her classmates.)
- 現在租房子很不容易,不是價錢太貴,就是房子不好, 麻煩得很。 现在租房子很不容易,不是价钱太贵,就是房子不好, 麻烦得很。 (It's really difficult to rent an apartment now. Either the rent is too expensive, or the
 - rooms are bad. It's a real hassle.)
- 昨天的晚會來的不是同學,就是朋友,他都認識。 **(3)** 昨天的晚会来的不是同学,就是朋友,他都认识。 (Those who came to the party were either classmates or friends. He knew them all.)
- 4 A: 你們常常吃牛肉嗎? 你们常常吃牛肉吗? (Do you often eat beef?)
 - 不, 我們平常不是吃雞, 就是吃魚, 不吃牛肉。 不, 我们平常不是吃鸡, 就是吃鱼, 不吃牛肉。 (No, we usually have either chicken or fish. We don't eat beef.)

J. 多 (How...it is!)

This is an adverb used as an intensifier in exclamatory sentences:

- ① 父母掙錢多不容易啊! 父母挣钱多不容易啊! (What a difficult thing for parents to make (enough) money!)
- 小明,外邊多冷呀,乖乖待在屋子裏,别出去亂跑。 小明,外边多冷呀,乖乖待在屋子里,别出去乱跑! (Little Ming, it's really cold out. Be a good boy and stay indoors. Don't go out.)


