Korean traditional side dish
made with **cabbage** and **Korean radish**, **gochugaru** (Korean chili powder), **spring onions**, **garlic**, **ginger**, and **jeotgal** (salted seafood)

It refers to food with low unit price and food such as **tteokbokki, kimbap, fish cake, sundae, fried rice, etc.**

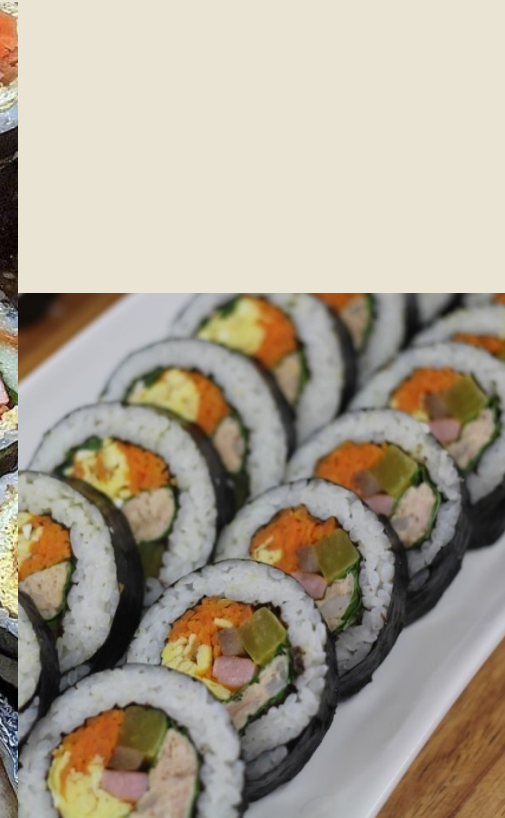
Since they are relatively inexpensive foods, there are many snack shops in front of the school
