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

=**I went yesterday.**

Sixth Principle(5W1H)

Where = 어디 [eo-di-seo]

Yoongi : 어디 BTS 콘서트 어디 ?

[i-beon BTS con-seo-teu eo-di-seo han-dae?]

=Where is the BTS concert going to be held?

Jenny : 서울에 !

[Seoul e-seo hae!]

=In Seoul!

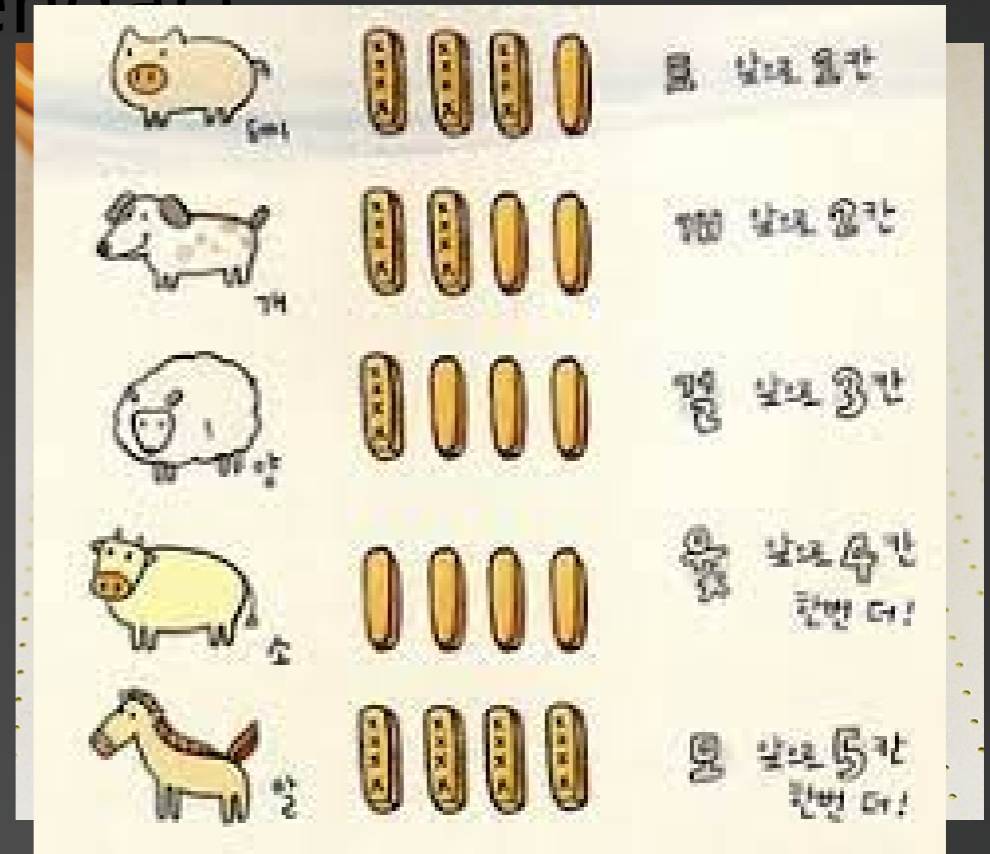
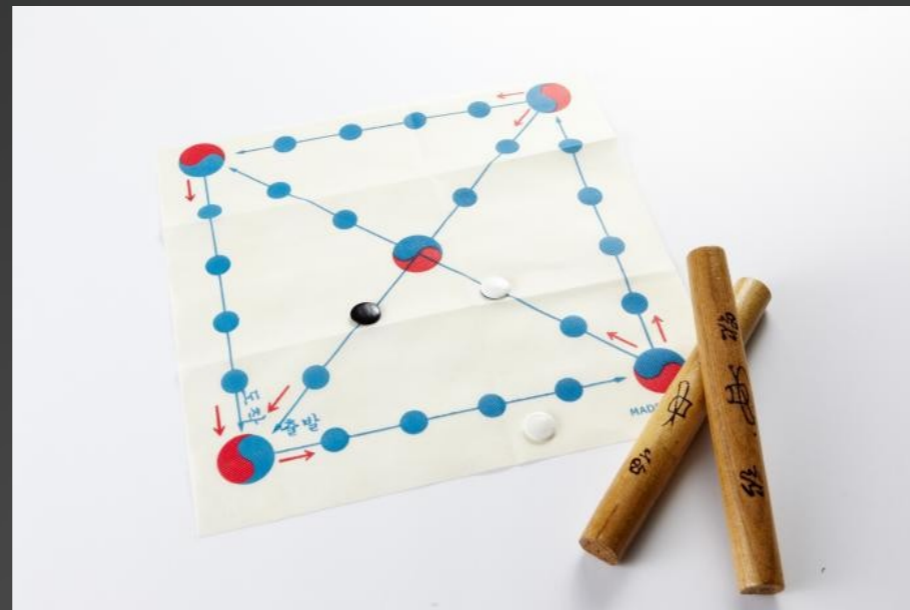
