Why pay attention to this documentary?

- 1. Rare film in postwar Japanese cinema production (esp. in the document genre)
- 2. Well received domestically but UNKOWN overseas
- 3. High pedagogical value (excellent teaching tool)

Japanese documentary film and WWII

- Generally extremely limited
- Atrocities committed by the Imperial Army avoided
- Particularly the Chinese war front is problematic
