Field/keywords of the Brno workshop:

Norwegian literature in history and the present; the variety of genres in the Norwegian literature; cultural discourse topics in the changing society; challenges of translatology, reception and new technologies today.

Classes are taught and organized by our specialists from the Department for Department of German, Scandinavian and Netherlands Studies at the Faculty of Arts, alongside visiting guest lecturers from The University in Tromsø, Inland Norway University of Applied Sciences, Norwegian Broadcasting Corporation, University in Gdansk, Babes-Bolyai University Cluj, Ludwig Maximilian University of Munich, Tischner European University, ELTE University of Budapest, University of Sofia, Charles University in Prague, Norwegian Embassy in Prague.
