





- ✓ Am , Are , Is = -다 , -이다 (da / I da)
- < Informal expression>
- → 야 [Ya]
- Ex) I am Haeryeon.
- Ex) What is that?

- 나는 해련<mark>이야</mark>.
- 저건 뭐<mark>야</mark>?

- < Polite Expression >
- → 에요 [Yeyo] =. 이에요 [i yae yo]
- Ex) I am Nahyun.
- Ex) What is this?
- 저는 나현<mark>이에요</mark>. 이건 뭐<mark>에요</mark>?

REVIEW - TOPIC MARKER

- Topic Marker 는 / 를
- → a grammatical particle used to mark the topic of a sentence.

- Ex) I ate chocolate. 나는 초콜렛<mark>을</mark> 먹었다.
- Ex) I like Korean. 나는 한국어<mark>를</mark> 좋아한다.

GRAMMAR - PALATALIZATION

• A phenomenon in which □, □ meets ' | ' [i] vowels and turns into 'ス, ㅊ'.


Example) 같이 /ga-ti/: together – 가치[gachi]

해돋이 /hae-do-di/ : <mark>sunrise</mark> – 해도지[hae-do-ji]



GRAMMAR - LIQUIDIZATION

'∟' is pronounced as [⊇] in front or behind ' ⊇'



Example) 논리 /non-li/ : logic – 놀리[nol-li]

온라인 :On-line – 올라인[OI-line]

난로 /nan-lo/: Stove – 날로[nal-lo]



GRAMMAR - NASALIZATION

 A phenomenon in which consonants other than the original nasal sounds are changed to nasal sounds (□, □, ○) under the influence of neighboring nasal sounds.

Example)

국물 : soup - 궁물[goong-mool]

대통령 : president – 대통녕[dae-tong-nyung]

국립 : national – 국닙 – 궁닙[goong-nip]
