Chicago Bulls

- strong meat packing tradition
- Matadors or Toreadors
- -"Dad, thats a bunch of bull!"



Denver Nuggets

- originally the Denver Rockets
- Gold Rush of the mid-1800s
- to make a fortune finding nuggets of gold



Detroit Pistons

- originally in Fort Wayne, Ind.

- owner Frank Zoller owned a piston factory for engines

- moved to the Motor City in 1957, name stuck



Golden State Warriors

- Oakland
- many moves
- team that belongs to all of California



Houston Rockets

- originally San Diego Rockets
- space industry was big there
- relocated to Houston name still fit



Indiana Pacers

- Indiana's history of harness racing pacers
- pace car used during the Indianapolis 500











Los Angeles Clippers

- Buffalo Braves moved to San Diego
- name did not fit
- San Diego home to large sailing ships, coined "clippers"



Los Angeles Lakers

- makes no sense for LA
- used to be in Minneapolis
- Minnesota Land of 10,000 Lakes



Milwaukee Bucks

- contest in 1968 for the name

- Bucks reflected the fish-andgame mentality



New Orleans Hornets/Pelicans

- originally Charlotte Hornets
- move to New Orleans
- hit with hurricanes
- "reflects our culture, our community and our resolve"
- resiliency and determination to come back



Philadelphia 76ers

- Syracuse Nationals

signing of the Declaration
 of Independence which
 happened in the city of
 Philadelphia



New York Knicks

- Knickerbockers – short version Knicks

 a name given to Dutch settlers who came to the New World

- lot of the in New York



Others

- Phoenix Suns
- Seattle SuperSonics
- Oklahoma City Thunder





Carolina Hurricanes

- Hurricanes Bertha and Fran

- owner chose name prior to their debut



Columbus Blue Jackets

blue coats worn by Union
 Soldiers during the Civil War

- Ohio had more soldiers in the Union Army (320 000) than any other state



Edmonton Oilers

- Alberta has the world's third-largest reserves



Florida Panthers

- Florida's state animal
- only < 100 panthers remain



St. Louis Blues

- after W.C. Handy's famous 1914 song
- no matter where you go in town there's singing
- spirit of St. Louis



Toronto Maple Leafs

- St. Pats

- 1927

- to honor Canada's soldiers who wore the Maple Leaf in WW1



Vancouver Canucks

- "Canuck" is slang for Canadian
- Johnny Canuck is a political cartoon character
- skating version of Johnny is
 Vancouver's secondary logo
