Structure:

1) **Short efficient description** of the object/monument and its properties (localization, museal history, material, technique, restorations, etc.)

2) <u>State of the art (what has been written by scholars about this object/monument, about its use/function/meaning, what are the main and most recent hypotheses</u>). Be concrete about the bibliography you have been using and that you have read about the object, for example:

"As argued by Bahrani, the representation of the goddess Ishtar on later Babylonian artifacts is due to the impact of Hellenistic trends in the reception of female naked deities."¹ or (Bahrani 1996)
