


Etruscan sarcophagus and lid with husband and wife, 350–300 BC, travertine











Plastered skull from Jericho, 8000-6000 BC, plaster, bone, shells

Hellenistic 323-30 BC Gaul Killing Himself and His Wife, 230-220 BC, marble roman copy




















INTERESTING OBJECTS



Liver of Piacenza, Etruscan model of a sheep's liver covered with inscriptions and subdivided into sections for use in fortune-telling, late 2nd century BC, bronze



Pillar with an offering to Asclepios, marble human face placed in a niche, with dedication by Praxias, 350-300 BC



Gundestrup cauldron, largest known European Iron age silver work, 200 BC- 300 AD, Gaulish/ Thracian/ Celtic origin?







Lady of Baza, 4th century BC, polychromed limestone funerary sculpture



Bronze hand used in the worship of Sabazios, Roman 1st—2nd century AD, hands decorated with religious symbols were designed to stand in sanctuaries or, like this one, were attached to poles for processional use


