1. INTRODUCTION

Greetings: Good morning/afternoon ladies and gentlemen.

Outline of the main parts: *Show them on the slide.*

I've divided my presentation into four parts/sections. They are...

First of allthen next and then we come to lastly/ last of all

• Show and read the **key words** giving the translation of less known expressions. (You can also put them on individual slides.)

Introduce the first part showing its title on the slide:

e.g. Let's start with...

Close the first part: e.g., So that covers the first part concerning....

Open the second part showing its title on the slide:

e.g., And now let me open the second part ...

Close the second part: e.g., Let's leave that here and turn to part 3.

Open and close the third (and the fourth) part in a similar way.

Close the main body: So that's all I could / wanted to tell you about...

And that brings me to the end of my presentation.

That completes my presentation.

That covers all I wanted to say today. Before I stop/finish, let me just say ...

3. ENDING
