Task 5 Grammar: Participle clauses

Participles are groups of words that act as adjectives. That is, they provide further information about the noun or nouns in a sentence. These phrases contain past or present participles. If they contain past participles, they'll end in -ed, or the 3rd form of an irregular verb. If they contain present participles, the verb will end in -ing.

Examples:
Once deprived of oxygen, the brain dies.
Used economically, the supplies will last for a month.
Judging from their expression, they didn't appreciate my answer.
Not wishing to continue my studies, I found a job in the fashion industry.
Being French, it's surprising he's such a bad cook.
After having submitted the report, we decided to knock off early.
